Before the May 2015 alumni council began, I headed over to The Dartmouth Bookstore where I bought Professor Peter Bien's new translation of Zorba the Greek. So why a new translation? As Prof. Bien notes, the earlier translation was made by someone who didn't know Greek. Just reading Bien's introduction is worth the price of the book.

I still remember Prof. Bien explaining how the Greek word for leaves falling from a tree was literally "de-armpitting." That remarkable image has stuck with me for over 40 years.

HANLON'S VISION

Early on in the conference, President Phil Hanlon '77 laid out his vision. He is determined to attract top rate academics and to prepare graduates who will make a difference in the world. While we will remain an institution with liberal arts at its core, Hanlon said we need to hit "home runs" to make that kind of difference.

With so much knowledge that can be downloaded for free, Hanlon talked about the importance of experiential learning.

Hanlon told us that Dartmouth intends to expand the Thayer School significantly.

He also said that the "Dartmouth Thrives" program, which will include components modeled after the successful Dartmouth Peak Performance (DP2) leadership program—aimed now at student athletes-is being developed as part of President Hanlon's Moving Dartmouth Forward initiative.

Worth noting. Ledyard Canoe Club and the Moosilauke lodge are being rebuilt.

BAN ON HARD ALCOHOL

The Moving Dartmouth Forward initiative is changing life on the Hanover Plain. Since a ban on hard alcohol went into effect in the beginning of the spring term, transports of

intoxicated students to the hospital or Dick's House have decreased significantly. The new emphasis will be socializing around wine or beer.

The Interim Dean of the College, Inge-Lise Ameer, said that Dartmouth continued to move toward a reorganization of residential life in which dormitories would be grouped as communities of houses. There will be six house communities in all – each composed of about 700 students, about half in residence at any one time – and each with a house professor.

The house professors will each serve a four-year term beginning July 1, 2015, and will move into on-campus residences near their respective house communities the following summer. The six house professors include biologist Ryan Calsbeek, astrophysicist Ryan Hickox, engineer Jane Hill, sociologist Kathryn Lively, mathematician Craig Sutton, and Japanese literary scholar Dennis Washburn.

I remember John Sloan Dickey's global vision which today inspires the John Sloan Dickey's Center for International Understanding. This summer the Dickey Center hosted 25 young African leaders for six weeks on campus.

Several students talk about how projects from working in a village in South Africa to consulting for a nonprofit in Peru have changed them.

The enormous cost of a college education came up. Bill Helman '80, chairman of the board of Dartmouth, said the cost of a year is actually \$100,000—beyond the apparent price of \$61,000. It's our contributions to the Alumni Fund and other college drives that brings down the real cost.
