What would you like to share with other head agents as a best practice or a "brag" this year?

Peter Fahey, our Class President, conceived the idea of a "Prodigal Son" or "We Want You Back" approach to classmates who have been uninvolved with the College or Class, with a goal to get them to consider attending our 50th Reunion in 2018 and to participate in the Annual Dartmouth College Fund. At our October 2015 Executive Committee Meeting, Peter distributed a list of classmates who have not paid dues or attended any class event, for editing (adding or subtracting names), and then circulated a draft letter, for discussion, to be sent to our unengaged classmates. The concept: include a \$10 bill, and invite their response, to indicate they will consider attending the reunion, and if they return the \$10, an anonymous classmate will donate \$90 (plus the requested \$10) to the College Fund in their name. After discussion, the Executive Committee supported the concept, with the letter to be sent out in January 2016. The letter went out to approximately 100 classmates. Result: 26 classmates returned the "\$10 letter", with 9 of them committing to come to the 50th Reunion in 2018. This effort allowed us to exceed our participation goal by 19 classmates and added \$810 to the FY2016 DCF Fund totals for the Class of 1968.


