



John H. Pilling has a private practice in Boston. Representative projects from his 1993 to 2015 partnership with Mark S. Smith are the Caritas St. Mary's Women and Children's Center, the Jenkins Scott Youth and Family Building, Dorchester House and Denison House Day Care Centers, the Fox Center, and Harbor Area Early Childhood Services. Before 1993, he worked in Memphis, Cambridge, Boston, and London as a principal and senior architect doing residential site plans, an amusement park, the MBTA Forest Hills Station, the Hatch Shell restoration study, headquarters for Apollo Computer and Epsilon Data Management, and the Canary Wharf Eastern Segment master plan.

John is a member of the faculty of the Boston Architectural College (BAC) He taught the course, "Designing Architectural Details" from 1993 to 2012. He has been a thesis advisor and panelist. His studios and courses, conducted with his colleague, Luis Montalvo include learning opportunities for students based on cities of Mexico and the Caribbean.
